During a special time of worship, we will reflect on what our church has meant in our community and in our own lives over the years. We will also look forward to our future together, and dream of what God has in store for us next.


Immediately following our worship service, we will have dinner on the grounds. The church will provide fried chicken and drinks, we ask that you provide side items and desserts.
